Conference Theme

We have seen tremendous change in our communities due to COVID, and prior to this, over the last decade, we have seen social upheaval in the public sphere, motivated in part by the election of unexpected leaders and deeply divisive social issues. Observing increasingly hostile and unequal socio-political circumstances, social scientists around the world have been pressed to respond to social issues on the ground, working directly with local organizations, governments, and groups. Universities are fostering interdisciplinary collaborations and adopting 'community-engaged' agendas where researchers are asked to cultivate partnerships with the members of the community and so lead to productive outcomes. As a critical and interdisciplinary discipline, theoretical psychology has for decades served to question, explore, and develop conceptual and research tools needed to deepen understandings of human existence in shifting social contexts.

We invite contributions to theoretical psychology from all scholarly approaches exploring different issues in theoretical psychology, and especially submissions that explore the following questions:

- How can theoretical psychological knowledge and practice reach local communities to contribute to positive social change?
- What psychological concepts, theories, approaches, and practices are helpful to improve research-community collaborations and social outcomes?

- In what ways is theoretical psychological knowledge addressing multi-disciplinary and multiprofessional audiences, and how can scholars increase the impact of their research to audiences outside of psychological circles?
- In what ways are contemporary social concerns (e.g., climate change, racial disparities, migration, homelessness, famine, nuclear threats) impacting the development of psychological knowledge and what responsibilities do we have as social scientists seeking to explain the realities of persons living in these contexts?
- What specific kind of contribution can theoretical psychology make to communities?

Community Engaged Sessions:



IRTP publishes one volume every two years of one or more issues. Each publication follows the previous conference, with peer-reviewed papers written by delegates on topics more or less closely connected to the conference theme, however always intellectually stimulating and of high academic and ethical standards.

<u>Theory & Psychology</u> is a fully peer-reviewed bi-monthly forum for theoretical and meta-theoretical analysis in psychology. The journal focuses on the emergent themes at the centre of contemporary psychological debate. Its principal aim is to foster theoretical dialogue and innovation within the discipline, serving an integrative role for a wide psychological audience.

This journal publishes scholarly and expository papers which explore significant theoretical developments within and across such specific sub-areas as: cognitive, social, personality, developmental, clinical, perceptual, or biological psychology. It also publishes, and particularly encourages, work with a broader meta-theoretical intent, examining such issues as the conceptual frameworks and foundations of psychology, its historical underpinnings, its relation to other human sciences, its methodological commitments, its ideological assumptions, and its

political and institutional contexts. Interdisciplinary analyses addressing psychological topics are welcomed.

Assistant Professor in Child and Adolescent Development - Open call

California State University, Sacramento

California State University, Sacramento invites applications for a tenure track position in Child and Adolescent Development at the Assistant Professor rank beginning Fall 2022. Faculty and staff are committed to diversity, equity, and inclusion to promote student success in academic, personal, and professional pursuits.

Required qualifications include a doctorate in Human or Child Development, Developmental Psychology, Education with emphasis/specialization in Development, or a closely related program resulting in Developmental expertise is required. (ABD considered – all degree requirements must be completed by August 2022). Candidates must have a strong background in developmental theory and research with any area of scholarly expertise; a demonstrated commitment to advancing social justice through teaching, research, and/or service; a demonstrated knowledge of applying theory and research to diverse real-world settings (e.g., education, community, policy); a demonstrated knowledge of and experience working with children, adolescents, students and/or families representing diverse populations from diverse backgrounds. Preferred qualifications include a clearly defined program of research and demonstrated success in research and scholarly activities; demonstrated experience working in an educational, community, or policy-related setting serving children, adolescents, and/or families; commitment to teaching student how to use their academic knowledge to serve children, adolescents, and families in diverse and inclusive real-world settings (e.g., fieldwork in classrooms or community, policy, research); evidence of leadership and strong interpersonal skills in a diverse environment; demonstrated experience and effectiveness in college level, undergraduate and/or graduate level teaching.

Responsibilities include teaching undergraduate and graduate courses in Child and Adolescent Development; maintaining a rigorous program of research; supervising and sponsoring student scholarship; assisting with advising and curriculum development/assessment; serving in various roles on committees and within leadership bodies at the program, college, university, and community levels; and working collegially with other faculty in a diverse environment. Salary is dependent upon qualifications and professional experience.

To apply, submit 1) a cover letter describing interest and qualifications for this position; 2) a current curriculum vitae; 3) a statement describing prior or proposed contributions and interest in promoting inclusion and equity through teaching, mentoring, service, and/or research; 4) a statement of teaching philosophy and interests (that incorporates a diverse perspective in teaching) and recent data on teaching effectiveness or teaching portfolio, if available; 5) a statement of research interests and agenda; 6) a writing sample (e.g., a recent publication); 7) the names and contact information of three references who can speak to the candidate's professional qualifications (no letters required); 8) unofficial transcripts of all graduate-level work (official copies required if offered the position).

Screening of applications to begin on January 5, 2022, with applications accepted until the position is filled. 
