### Dear members of the ISTP



At the conference, I was fascinated by the culture of conversation and the mode of theorizing. There was a multitude of different perspectives in an open, substantial, and exciting dialogue, which unfolded not only as a back and forth of perspectives, but as a merging of perspectives and a way of thinking and working together and doing theory collectively. Furthermore, I was surprised by the form of social relationship and the way people were talking with each other. Not an aggressive, competitive, instrumental but a trustful, resonating, and critical-constructive mode of conversation, informed not by the formal position of a person but by the content and what a person had to say. It was quite a unique experience to encounter such a strong academic culture of openness, curiosity, collaboration.

Since then, I have been able to follow how our society has been flourishing. Our conferences grew in seize, our membership increased, and we became more of an international society.

### **Events - News**



The International Environmental Justice Committee (IEJC) was established in November 2021 at the APA Division 52 International Psychology. Its goals are fostering the international psychology debate on the environmental crisis and the challenges that mankind is likely to face in the next and remote future, having an impact on human individual and collective psychological processes, social inequalities, environmentally conscious conducts, and eventually the survival of the human collectivity as we know it. The task of the IEJC is to produce and collect information, events of discussion, and proposals to have environmental and inequalities challenges as core interests of international psychology, concerning theoretical, professional, therapeutic, educational, and ethical aspects of human conduct in the ecosystem.

The types of actions that the committee can undertake are:

- Collect and make available sources about the psychological aspects of environmental challenges;
- Promote events (webinars, conferences, scientific collaborations) at the international level;
- Promote networking and joint research projects at the international level to advance knowledge about the psychology of environmental challenges;
- Promote formative activities (webinars; courses; etc.) for students and professionals;
- Promote interdisciplinary collaboration with other international actors.

IEJC launched a collaborative reading list of books related to environmental justice and psychology. The purpose is to provide psychologists with a rich and interdisciplinary source of knowledge and inspiration for research and intervention, based on the contribution of scholars involved in the struggle for environmental justice worldwide. The reading list is a work-in-progress, and everyone can suggest an entry by contacting the IEJC.

IEJC is co-chaired by Luca Tateo and Pina Marsico, and it is currently composed by 10 members.




The subject of this edition concerns the 21st century challenges for research in developmental and educational psychology.

Proposals are accepted in French and in English.




The book provides a comprehensive analysis of Vygotsky's and Piaget's theories implementation in modern preschool education. It analyses the problem of the relationship between the natural and the cultural the context of Vygotsky and Jean Piaget theories. Their discourses complemented each other: whereas Vygotsky developed his theory in the direction from society (culture) to the individual child, Piaget's movement was the opposite: from individual child to society. These two approaches confront modern world with the need to analyse the problem of childhood: is childhood a period of cultural exploration or is it a special form of relationship in which both the egocentrism and consciousness of the child, and the and consciousness egocentrism represented?

### **New Perspectives on Mind-Wandering**

Dario, N. & Tateo, L. (2022). Springer.


In the last decade, a great variety and volume of scholarly work has appeared on mind-wandering, a mental process involving a vast range of human life, "first-person perspective" connected with "personhood", submental thinking, mental autonomy, etc. While different and emerging features that flow into and out of one another (second field, mental travel, visual imagery, inner speech, unspecific memory, autobiographical memory, fantasies, introspection, etc.) and negative and positive approaches seem to describe mind-wandering, we offer an interdisciplinary theoretical and empirically informed and informative overview on mind-wandering studies and methodologies oriented toward the educational field. The aim is to transform and enrich the debate on mind-wandering but also to show



how theoretical arguments and research findings could inform the teaching-learning context.

This ground-breaking book moves along three representations of developed scientific knowledge: imaginary lines, circles and spirals. The first section, "The Lines", develops new lines of inquiry on attention (selective and sustained) and mind-wandering, the influence of age and mind-wandering, embodiment, consciousness and experience and mind-wandering. In the second section, the "Circles", groups of Chapters on the same topic, methodology (tasks and measurement), intervention (auditory beat stimulation and mindfulness practices) and creativity, recreate a dance of interacting parts in which there are always profitable, decisive and retroactive exchanges between the information that each group or author activates. The last section, "The Spirals", critically discusses the absence of a unified theoretical perspective, in the pedagogical field, attentive both to the processes of emergence and the interactions between parts.

The world's first complete edition of this classic text by Lev Vigotski.

Written during the Russian Revolution and in the face of the tasks that it posed, the book remained censored and distorted by Stalinism and academic manipulation for almost half a century. This edition, translated directly into Spanish from Russian by Alejandro Ariel González, is the first complete version of the work worldwide, as there is no complete version even in Russian. It allows us to enter into the reading of Vigotski and his "cultural-historical" theory through the door that censorship kept closed for decades: that of his Marxist philosophy and methodology.

In this edition, all the omissions and additions made by the Soviet editors, as well as the systematic errors in the

available translations, have been identified. Also, all the bibliography used by the author has been re-established, and the attribution of quotations has been revised and corrected.

This book analyses the reception of Soviet psychology and its impacts in mental health research and practice in Argentina.







Across the array of topics explored in this comprehensive volume, philosopher and psychoanalyst Jon Mills argues for a fundamental return to the question and meaning of existence. Psyche, Culture, World will be of interest to philosophers, psychoanalysts, psychologists, academics, and students in the arts and humanities, cultural studies, anthropology, myth, psychology of religion, and psychotherapy.




